Training Opportunities Available to Campus Law Enforcement

The **Federal Law Enforcement Training Centers** offers training on a wide range of subjects that may be of interest to campus law enforcement agencies. Many programs are available to state, local and tribal law enforcement at low-cost or no-cost. [Active Shooter Threat Training Program \(ASTTP\)](#) is an intensive and challenging program covering a variety of tactical subjects for responding officers including: Single Officer Response Tactics, Limited Penetration Tactics, Tactical Medical Training, Multiple Officer Response and Link-Up Procedures, Response to an Explosive Hazard, and Post Shooting Considerations. 4 Days. Center-based or Export.

[Active Shooter Threat Instructor Training Program \(ASTITP\)](#) is designed for field training agents or officers and takes active shooter threat tactics training to the next level by emphasizing leadership, teach backs, and adult learning. *This program is not designed to train specialty or SWAT team movement or tactics.* 5 Days. Center-based or Export.

[Advanced Interviewing for Law Enforcement Investigators \(AILEITP\)](#) is a science-based course to teach students how to effectively obtain information from suspects, witnesses, and victims through various interview methods, techniques and theories. 5 Days. Center-based or Export.

[Basic Incident Response to Digital Evidence \(BIRDE\)](#) trains criminal investigators with the skills for taking proper steps necessary to identify, collect, acquire, and preserve digital evidence during the conduct of an investigation. 3 Days. Center-based or Export.

[Tactical Medical for First Responders \(TMFR\)](#) teaches officers and investigators to apply techniques to treat life-threatening injuries in an austere environment. 1 Day. Center-based or Export.

[Basic Tactical Medical Instructor Training Program \(BTMITP\)](#) is a highly intense training that addresses treating life-threatening injuries in an austere environment with limited equipment, lack of medically trained personnel and prolonged time to evacuation. Upon graduation from the BTMITP, students will be able to design and deliver tactical medical training programs for their agency. 3 Days. Center-based or Export.

[Critical Communication Skills in Officer/Citizen Encounters Instructor Training Program \(CCSITP\)](#) is designed to teach law enforcement academy instructors and field training officers (FTOs) teach critical communication skills in officer-citizen encounters to defuse conflict through a greater understanding of diverse communities and different communication styles. 4 Days. Center-based or Export.

[Physical Security Assessment Training \(PSAT\)](#) provides training on how to evaluate the existing physical security at a variety of locations such as schools and houses of worship, and produce a report designed to provide decision makers an overview of the physical security concerns and/or deficiencies, along with recommended mitigation strategies. 3 Days. Export. *This is a new program and is not listed in the FLETC course catalog.*

[Cyber Tools for Active Shooter Prevention and Response \(CASPR\)](#) familiarizes investigators with open-source tools and advanced search functions within social media sites to help them locate and identify potential threats to public safety, and how to detect, neutralize and collect internet-connected devices/smart devices for use in intelligence gathering and possible presentation in a court of law. 3 Days. Export only. *This is a new program and is not listed in the FLETC course catalog.*

Sexual Assault Prevention and Response in Campus and Residential Training Settings will be a 4-day online summit in which attendees will hear from nationally recognized speakers who share lessons learned and best practices in the jurisdictions of colleges/universities, military, and law enforcement academy settings. **25 - 28 September, 12:30 – 4:30 PM (EDT)**

Threat Assessment & Threat Management is a virtual training program focused on preventing acts of targeted violence. It identifies observable factors and behaviors that may indicate a person of concern is at risk of committing violence, and opportunities for external intervention will be discussed. Additionally, the community team approach to threat assessment and threat management is explained, and appropriate methods of intervention and management for people of concern are identified.
